Marina Ciampi: She talked about the decision of lockdowns with respect to the its managerial and organizational aspects and in the innovation and creative choises that were inspired by the emergency that may be useful in such a case in the future. Also she shared a video of the situation in Italy during the outbreak. Consequences of the pandemic crisis and also effects of it on humanbeings in sociological level were determined. The problems and the solutions to those problems were mentioned in this video.

Tito Marci: He talked about the elements of the documentary that was shared by Marina and made some comment on it. Italy's reaction to the problem was about approaching to it by creativity in the social, religious, artistic and academic fields. The documentary showed out that how humanbeings reacts in an emergency situation. This case might help people to estimate another emergency situation in the future in the related fields, possible outcomes as problems and solutions to them.

Saeb Farhan Al Ganideh: He made a presentation titled as the impact of Covid-19 on refugeehosting countries, he analyzed it for the case of Jordan. He started to his presentation by giving brief information about Jordan, and then, the economy of Jordan and the impacts of Covid-19 outbreak on the economy were discussed. Especially the services industry was the most effected one among other industries. To this, the Jordanian government implemented some rules such as; it closed land and air borders, banned gatherings of 10 people or more, and developed quarantine centers to prepare for a rise in cases. And he halked about the acceptance of population to this restrictions. Impacts of the outbreak on the other sectors were also mentioned by him during his presentation. As a conclusion, he mentioned possible upcoming impacts of the out the outbreak that Jordian population may be faced with.

Stavros D. Mavroudeas: He made presentation titled as the political economy of Covid-19. He had a point that this crisis is actually a twin crisis because there is a simultaneous causality between health crisis and economic crisis. Those two crisis strengthened the impacts of each others. After that he analyzed some causes of the new emerging epidemics.

Agon Memeti: He had a presentation named the relationship between student attitudes toward online learning and environmental factors during Covid-19 pandemic and showed a correlational analysis study. Results of his study showd that negative attitudes related to the difficulties was created by environmental conditions. His study findings recommend that higher education institutions should consider these environmental factors during online teaching.

Esra Ergün Alış: She made a presentation about the effects of Covid-19 pandemic in Turkey. She talked about how the pandemic was managed by the authoriy, Minister of Health. And also, some examples of precautions day by day were mentioned.

Juan Agullo: He made a presentation about Covid-19 and inequality. He shared his hypothesis that Covid-19 pandemic in Latin America, in the long run, could cause similar effects to those of the "Lost Decade". And he released some statistics on public health impact topic. He also mentioned political impacts of the outbreak and gave examples of Colombia, Chile and Brazil. After that, social and economic impacts were examined and some economic indicators as growth, unemployment, inequality and macroeconomic imbalances were discussed. In conclusion, he concluded that the health impact reflects deep structural problems, the political impact reflects the institutional issues and the economic impacts creates a similar scenario to the existing before the "Foreign Debt Crisis". Lastly, he had a point on the similarity between the Lost Decade and Covid-19 pandemic.
